

Sport Canada Research Initiative (SCRI) Conference 2017

Research Presentation Guidelines

We are very excited to have you presenting your research at this year's Sport Canada Research Initiative Conference. To increase the awareness of your research and to enhance the knowledge exchange with delegates we are pleased to invite both individual and table Q&As to complement the Research Presentations, as well as a panel discussion following your presentation.

Please note: Presentations should focus on the **practical applications** of the research in the context of its contribution to enhancing **sport** participation

Presentation Format:

- There will be up to 3 Research presentation segments during the day
- Each segment will include 2 or 3 research presentations
- Individual research presentations are scheduled to be **15 minutes** in length

Panel:

- There will be approximately 3 panelists for each plenary presentation
- Panelists will represent the three perspectives of policy, research, or practice in the field.
- Panelists will be given 5 minutes to speak following your presentation, followed by 2 minutes for you to address their comments.
- Panelists will speak to following points:
 - Highlight a few key points that resonate with them in their role as a practitioner/policy maker/academic
 - The impact of the research findings on their work
 - What new questions were raised
 - Whether the research supports or conflicts with their current approach and thinking

Slides:

- 6-8 slides (**maximum 8 slides**)
- "minimize the number of words to maximize the message"
- Graphics are a great way to enhance interest on slides
- Black text on white background is recommended
- Font size recommendations:
 - Titles: 40 point
 - Subtitles or bullets: 32 point
 - Context text no smaller than 24 point

NOTE: Final slides are required to be submitted by **July 19, 2017** in order to allow for translation and publishing in the Conference material. **No changes will be made to slides after this date.**
