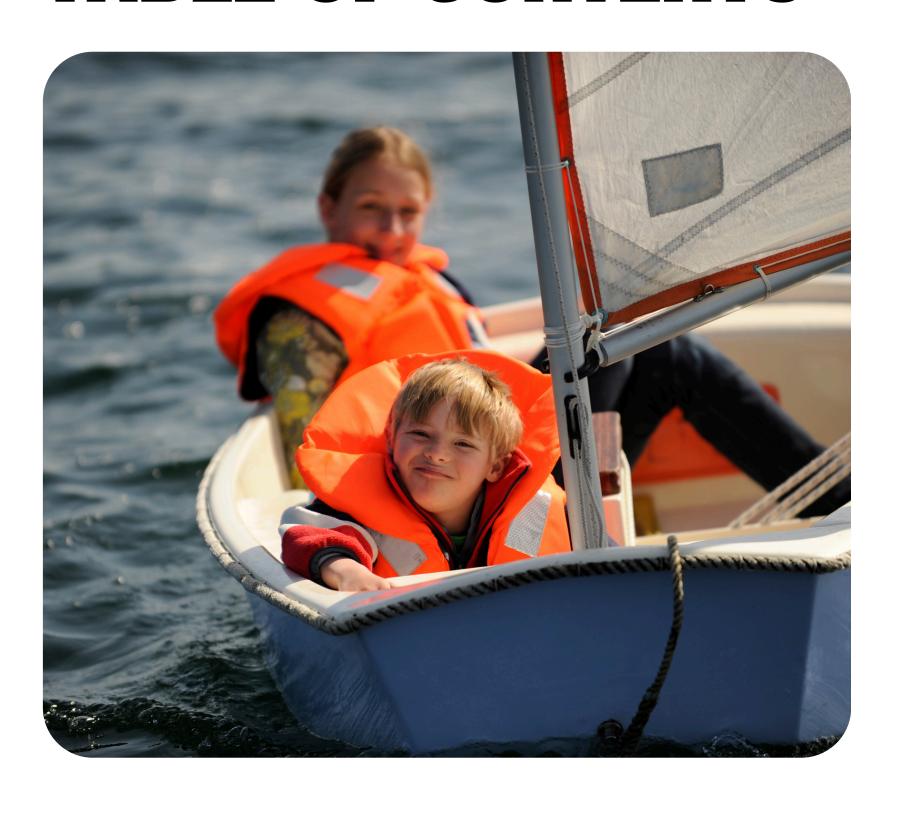

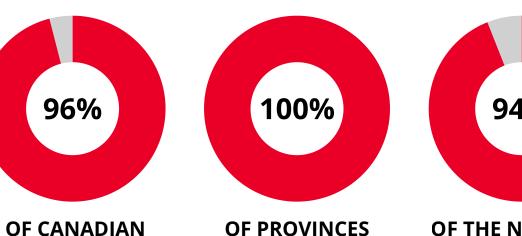
Over the past year, SIRC made a meaningful impact across the Canadian sport landscape with an emphasis on reaching Canadian communities through a dynamic and growing digital presence.

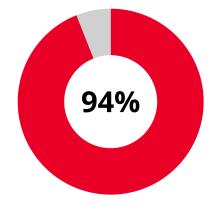

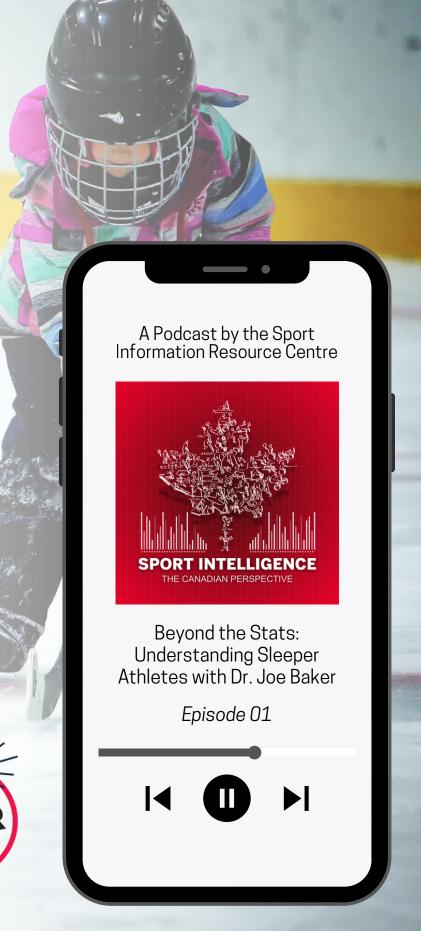

#### DIVERSIFICATION OF CHANNELS AND CONTENT STRATEGIES

To meet the evolving needs of Canada's sport system, SIRC expanded and diversified its communications. In 2024, we launched two new podcasts in both of Canada's official languages <u>Sport Intelligence: The Canadian Perspective</u> and <u>Intelligence sportive: la perspective</u> canadienne. Available on all major podcast platforms (Spotify, Apple Music, iHeartRadio, etc.), the series targets the **18–34-year-old demographic**, Canada's emerging sport leaders. This approach aligns with recent data indicating that **39% of Canadian adults** regularly consume podcast content.

SIRC also introduced **TL;DR** (**Too Long; Didn't Read**) **audio snippets**, which are short audio summaries of key research insights, available in both English and French. Paired with infographics and other visual knowledge translation tools, these formats increase accessibility and extend the lifespan of sport research.

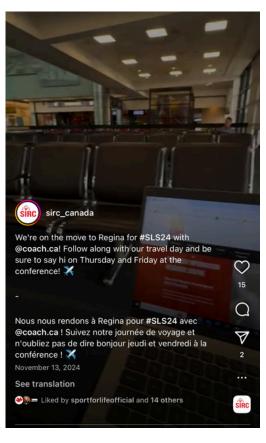


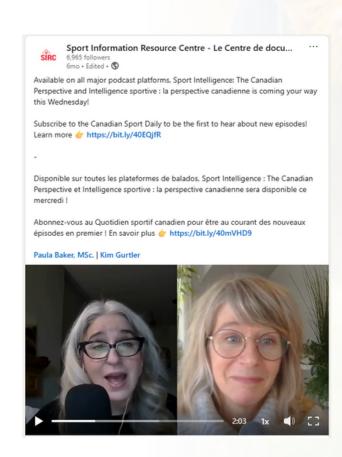

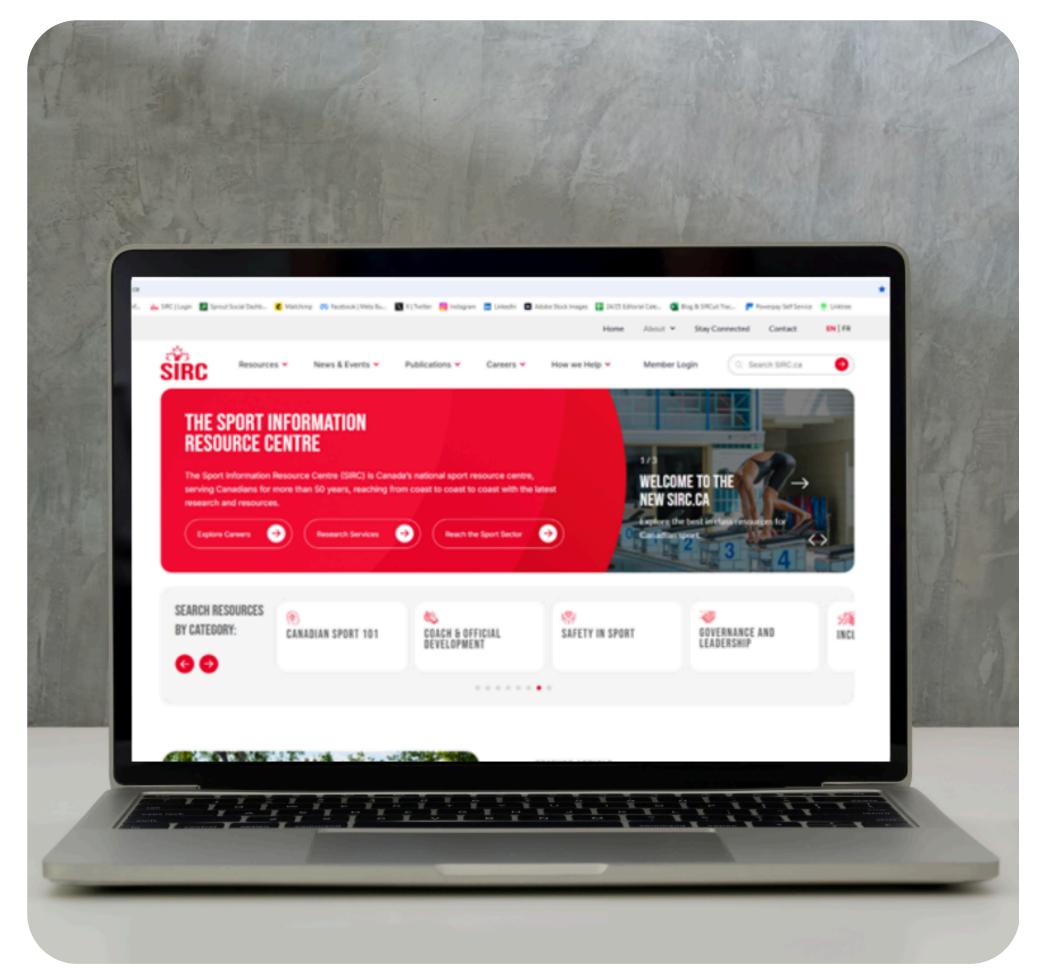




#### REDESIGNING SIRC.CA

To reflect our role as Canada's trusted sport knowledge hub, SIRC **redesigned its website** in 2024. The update focused on user experience, with improved navigation and search functions that make it easier to find high-quality resources.

A new **accessibility widget** was also added to remove barriers and enable more Canadians to use the platform. The updated design better reflects SIRC's evolving role and strengthens our ability to **communicate** who we are and how we can help the sport sector thrive.

SIRC's strength lies in its ability to convene and connect. As the National resource centre, we continued to serve as a central hub for sport knowledge and collaboration. Through our robust communication channels, we delivered **tailored messaging** to key audiences, including:

Advancing knowledge excellence is central to SIRC's mission. Top-performing episodes of SIRC's new bilingual podcast included *The* **Unspoken Battle: How Body Image Shapes Sport Performance** and Cirque du Soleil : Combler le fossé entre athlètes et artistes.

#### **AMPLIFYING RESOURCES AT SIRC.CA**

The 2024 redesign of SIRC.ca also focused on providing the best resources in priority areas such as:

- SAFETY IN SPORT
- **GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP**
- INDIGENOUS RECONCILIATION
- INCLUSION AND EQUITY
- **ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT**
- COACH AND OFFICIAL DEVELOPMENT
- **CANADIAN SPORT POLICIES**

For each of the 17 topics included within these priority sections, a list of **Top 10 Resources** were curated by leading academic researchers with lived experience.

Following the relaunch, the most-visited sections included **Safety in Sport** and **Leadership and Governance**, signaling the sector's focus on integrity, accountability, and safe environments.

The **user experience** remained a cornerstone of the redesign. Enhanced search functionality and streamlined navigation now make accessing resources faster, easier, and more intuitive.

#### **SPORT PARTICIPATION RESEARCH INITIATIVE**

In 2024, SIRC reimagined the Sport Canada Research Initiative (SCRI) conference in strategic partnership with Sport for Life (S4L) with **two featured sessions** at the **S4L Summit** in January 2025.

- Speed Networking Session: Facilitated rapid one-on-one connections between researchers and sport leaders to promote collaboration and future partnerships.
- Poster Sharing Session & Social Hour: Created an informal, interactive environment where researchers including several SPRI-funded grant recipients could showcase their work and engage with attendees following keynote presentations.

#### **SPORT PARTICIPATION RESEARCH INITIATIVE**

This new approach introduced dynamic opportunities to share research and foster collaboration, most notably through the launch of a new centralized **Sport Participation Research Initiative (SPRI) Portal** on SIRC.ca.

This portal enhances the research found in <u>over 130 Knowledge Translation Papers</u> also found on SIRC.ca, marking a significant evolution in sport research mobilization by prioritizing innovation, accessibility, and relevance for knowledge users across the country. This digital hub built through a multi-phase Knowledge Mobilization (KM) strategy that features:

- RESEARCH CATEGORIZED BY THEME AND SPORT CONTEXT
- **OVER SET OF THE PROPERTY AND KNOWLEDGE PRODUCTS**
- TAILORED RESOURCES FOR PRACTITIONERS, POLICY-MAKERS, AND SPORT LEADERS
- SUBMISSION TOOLS FOR RESEARCHERS TO EASILY SHARE FINAL REPORTS

Throughout 2024–2025, SIRC provided ongoing support to SPRI researchers, monitoring progress and sharing metrics with Sport Canada, helping to build a stronger, more connected research ecosystem across the country.

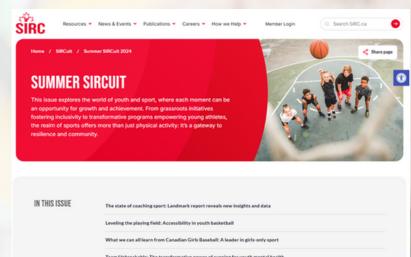
#### LEVERAGING THE SIRC NETWORK

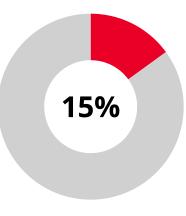

#### RESEARCH AND PARTNERSHIPS

In its first full year, SIRC's newly launched **Research and Partnerships (RAP) team** made a significant impact across Canada's sport system. Completing **over 30 research projects** with national and community sport organizations.

#### **EXPANDING PROJECT SCOPE AND METHODOLOGIES**

The RaP team delivered projects across a wide range of formats, including:

- Literature reviews on youth sport trends, climate action, affordability, and equity barriers.
- Evaluation frameworks using models like **RE-AIM** and **Social Return on Investment (SROI)**.
- **Resource development** for inclusive programming, such as the Active Start guide for children with disabilities.
- **Knowledge mobilization** through national webinars on Truth and Reconciliation and conference presentations on racial equity and social justice in sport.

#### RESEARCH AND PARTNERSHIPS

#### STRENGTHENING SPORT ORGANIZATIONS NATIONWIDE

SIRC partnered with more than a dozen organizations—including the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC), Ringette Canada, Alpine Canada, KidSport, and others—to deliver tailored research, strategic evaluations, and knowledge mobilization initiatives.

These collaborations supported national planning efforts, such as Alpine Canada's EDI strategy and the Shooting Federation of Canada's membership growth initiatives, and helped organizations assess and communicate their social impact through tools developed for programs like the **Olympic Day Grant, Team**Canada Impact Agenda, and the Women on the Bench Policy.

#### ADVANCING EQUITY, INCLUSION, AND CULTURAL RELEVANCE

SIRC played a lead role in developing the <u>Fair Play Report</u> with the COC, RBC, and Wasserman—elevating national dialogue on racial inclusion in high-performance sport. The team also led the <u>Racial Equity in Sport</u> Project behind the report, coordinating advisory committees, demographic analysis, and focus groups to identify systemic barriers and propose actionable solutions.

Internationally, SIRC represented Canada in a tri-national partnership with the Canadian Network for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination in Sport (CNERJ), conducting a pan-American literature review and environmental scan on the experiences of racialized athletes. Findings were shared at the March 2025 CNERJ Conference in Toronto.















#### **RESEARCH AND PARTNERSHIPS**

#### INCLUSIVE OUTREACH AND CAMPAIGN LEADERSHIP

In partnership with **Ringette Canada and the Lower Mainland Ringette League**, SIRC co-developed the *Learnings from an Indigenous Ringette Program* and translated *Come Try Ringette* materials into Tagalog, Hindi, Punjabi, and Mandarin—boosting participation and representation in British Columbia.

SIRC also led the design, implementation, and evaluation of the national <u>"Hey Canada, Come Try Ringette"</u> campaign with Ringette Canada and Bell Media. This initiative increased visibility for ringette, attracted new participants from diverse backgrounds, and provided actionable insights to inform future sport promotion efforts.

Extending its impact beyond national sport organizations, SIRC collaborated with **Sport North** and Indigenous author **Michelle Good** to deliver a **Land Acknowledgements webinar**, advancing cultural awareness and reconciliation within the broader Canadian sport community.







# SUPPORTING GOVERNANCE AND CAPACITY BUILDING

SIRC supports governance and capacity-building by offering practical tools and resources designed to strengthen organizational performance across the sector. Our three-pronged governance support includes:

#### **KNOWLEDGE SHARING**

Publishing the **Sport Leadership and Governance Trend Reports**, highlighting best practices in board composition, conflicts of interest, recruitment, onboarding, and succession planning.

#### **PROMOTING OPPORTUNITIES**

Sharing calls for Board of Directors nominations through the SIRC job board to help organizations attract top-tier talent with sport-specific expertise.

#### **C** ENHANCING THE ONBOARDING EXPERIENCE

Launched in 2024, Canadian Sport 101 is a new online resource that offers a comprehensive overview of Canada's sport system, including key contexts, guiding questions, and sector-shaping issues. SIRC encourages organizations to include this resource in onboarding packages to provide new Board members with a foundational understanding of the sport landscape.

#### **BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS ACROSS THE SECTOR**

## INTERNATIONAL CONNECTIONS AND KNOWLEDGE SHARING

SIRC was represented at the **Joint Commission of Sport Medicine and Science (JCSMS)** conference
in Cleveland, sharing insights and building
international relationships that support evidenceinformed practices back home.

#### **NATIONAL COLLABORATION IN ACTION**

Attended the **Sport Leadership sportif (SLS) conference** in Regina, hosted by the Coaching Association of Canada, reinforcing SIRC's commitment to leadership development and sector-wide collaboration.

#### **COAST-TO-COAST ENGAGEMENT**

From Halifax to Vancouver, SIRC made meaningful in-person connections across Canada. In Halifax, SIRC team members visited **St. Mary's University**, hosting meet-and-greets with key sport stakeholders in the region. We also engaged directly with partners at **Sport Nova Scotia** and with provincial leaders at **viaSport BC**.

## CHAMPIONING COMMUNITY-BASED RESEARCH

SIRC attended the MLSE LaunchPad Research
Summit in March, engaging with research rooted
in community sport. These connections continue
to inform our inclusive and practical knowledge
mobilization strategies.



## **EXPANDING INFLUENCE THROUGH THOUGHT LEADERSHIP**

In September, a SIRC team member represented on a panel hosted by the **Canadian Public Relations Society,** a new audience for SIRC that showcased our versatility in bridging sport, communications, and public policy.

#### **GLOBAL PRESENCE ON THE ROAD TO PARIS**

As excitement builds for the **Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games**, SIRC's presence in Paris marked a strategic opportunity to build global partnerships and elevate Canadian sport research on the world stage.
